The Advocates met 2 times this month, May 9th and May 23rd. In each meeting the advocates are introduced. Here's what was discussed.

On May 9th, Attendees of this meeting included special guest speaker and I.T. Director George Myers, Board Member Hunter Robinson, Special Olympics athletes Sabrina and DJ as well as guests from Easter Seals, First Capital Enterprises and Goodwill.

The meeting was turned over to I.T. Director George Myers who gave a presentation about internet safety and the different facets through which someone can fall victim to online scams and harm. He told stories to help add emphasis to these harms.

George Myers asked the attendees about what apps the attendees use and what things they do within these apps. He broke these answers into different categories and helped to give tips within each of these categories to remember to keep people safe. Some of these tips included only shopping on trusted and known websites or encrypted websites. He mentioned using virtual credit cards on these

sites. Outside of the shopping category he advised to only add people you know in real life on your social media platforms and report any suspicious accounts trying to add you as a friend. As far as tips within the online dating platforms he recommended that people use reputable websites, being cautious when taking conversations from these platforms offline and informing trusted others of any locations when you meet with someone from a dating app. He advised to be careful of knowing what is legal and illegal when looking at adult entertainment and to be aware of phishing emails. Some further discussion about attendees experiences with hacking and scams occurred.

The meeting was then turned back over to Austin Speakman where we did our Crusade For Change and asked people to detail any issues with accessibility and being mistreated due to our disabilities over the time since the last we met. After some discussion about accessibility issues at different restaurants the meeting was adjourned.

On May 23rd, Advocate Austin Speakman introduced Advocate Conor McMahon who proceeded to give a presentation on obsessive compulsive disorder or OCD. In this presentation he spoke about various aspects of OCD including what it is like for him personally to live with it, some of the repeated behaviors and patterns he and others with OCD do, a movie called What About Bob that showcases OCD and how it impacted him as a child. He went on to define the mental illness, speak on the symptoms and how

OCD forms as well as ways in which one with OCD can help such as therapy, cognitive learning and medication.

The second guest speaker, Superintendent Amy Beeler, was then introduced by Advocate Austin Speakman. Amy proceeded to speak about her past as a radio dispatcher for the police, being a member of State Highway Patrol and an investigator of speech pathologists. She continued to speak about how she got involved with the developmental disability field, working her way up through the SOCOG organization to becoming the Superintendent of the Board.

Free Admission to National Parks

The Access Pass is a free, lifetime pass, available to U.S. citizens or permanent residents of the United States

It is available to U.S. citizens or permanent residents of the United States that have been medically determined to have a permanent disability (does not have to be a 100% disability) - that provides admittance to more than 2,000 recreation sites managed by six Federal agencies.

At many sites the Access Pass provides the pass owner a discount on Expanded Amenity Fees (such as camping, swimming, boat launching, and guided tours).
